Dear Parents and Friends of Melrose Primary

Our first assembly for the year was held last Tuesday a week ago. Thank you to the families and friends who came. This year we plan to have assemblies in the morning when the weather dictates, commencing at 9am, to coincide with dropping off students. We hope this time will suit.

Talented singers – Lilly, Olivia, Peyton, Grace and Jade led us with the singing of the National Anthem and Miss Wanda's class gave the Acknowledgement of Country which they had written themselves.

The semester 1 SRC group was announced to the school, a welcome to our Reception students was made and school awards presented based on our four school values – Responsibility, Respect, Excellence and Honesty.

Artwork was also presented from both classes.

We also welcome to our school Miss Georgia Foulis, who is undertaking her final teaching practice in the Junior Primary class.

Leaders Day Monday 6th March

This Monday I attended the annual Principal/Leaders Day in Adelaide and on Tuesday attended the department's Numeracy Summit. These two days are invaluable to learn of the latest directions of the education department and what support we can expect as well as what we need to do to continue to deliver a quality education to our school communities.

The Leaders Day focussed on the theme of building a world-leading education system. During the day we worked in teams discussing the complexity of what's shaping our learners' contexts. We looked at current educational research, social analytics and trend data, SA's early years, digital learning, the world of work, rethinking equity, and the role of public education in South Australian society.

Numeracy Summit Tuesday 7th March

The day was based on the work of the day's keynote speaker Peter Sullivan Emeritus Professor of Education, Monash University.

The address detailed goals of education and in particular numeracy, including facilitating student agency and fostering inclusion. Strategies were outlined to support ongoing improvement in mathematics. This included:

- ways professional learning can focus on classroom experiences that are productively challenging
- importance of teaching practices that foster inclusion
- contribution of sequences to consolidate learning
- centrality of positive classroom culture
- student-centred structured inquiry in engaging all students to think for themselves and see struggle and risk as normal aspects of mathematics and numeracy learning.

Recently Ms Crawford from the Booleroo Centre District School forwarded me some information about the origins of the names of the two-house teams.

Mr W.H Dunstan, the First President of the Booleroo Centre School Council, donated a House Shield in 1934. The other schoolhouse was named after Mr F Rogers, also active in the school's affairs. The house system was introduced with the establishment of the new school in 1930. Both Mr Dunstan and Mr Rogers were both active community members who, back in 1931, combined forces with Booleroo Centre Parents Association and the High School Council to protest strongly against the closing of country High Schools.

W.H Dunstan was president of the High School Council from 1932-1934 and F Rogers president of the High School Council from 1934-1941.
